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Relating To Self Harm And

For all people presenting following an act of self-harm, initial assessment should include: Physical risk. Psychological state, risk of further self-harm or suicide, and presence of any mental health conditions. Any safeguarding concerns relating to the person and also any children, young people, or vulnerable adults dependent on them for care.

Every day in Australia, nearly 150 hospitalisations and 14 emergency department (ED) presentations involve opioid harm, and 3 people die from drug-induced deaths involving opioid use. In 2016, the number of opioid deaths (1,119) was the highest number since the peak in 1999 (1,245 deaths).

Justifiable use of deadly force is defined in Florida Statute Section 776.012(2): A person is justified in using or threatening to use deadly force if he or she reasonably believes that using or threatening to use such force is necessary to prevent imminent death or great bodily harm to himself or herself or another or to prevent the imminent commission of a forcible felony.
